Wall Residences is excited to announce our newest service available to individuals and their support teams. The **Behavior Support Team** is comprised of highly trained team members in every region of the state, including registered behavior technicians and positive behavior support facilitators who are overseen by a Board-Certified Behavior Analyst. Heather Cromer,

Behavioral Coordinator, BCBA, and LBA, oversees this team. As an agency, we recognize that there is a significant need for behavioral supports and that this need typically comes with a long wait

time to receive consultation from an outside agency.

Our mission, through the Behavior Support Team, is to provide person-centered behavioral supports and fulfill training needs as they arise. If challenging behaviors are interfering with quality of life for someone that you support, please reach out to your program manager who can make a referral to the Behavior Support Team. There are many individuals across the state who are already benefiting from this new, available support.

Wall Residences Nursing Services

Wall Residences is expanding nursing services offered to individuals in our services and currently has three full-time registered nurses. We are working on recruiting a fourth RN and many full and part-time licensed practical nurses (LPNs).

Nursing services range from providing direct, hands on skilled care to supporting regional training needs. Jessa Layne, RN, Medical Quality Assurance Director has been with the agency for over six years and is responsible for overseeing nursing services. Kevyn Burn, RN and Heidi Crowder, RN are the other full-time registered nurses for Wall Residences.
